



GOALS OF PILOT

- To use OneNote software to build planning and organizational skills in intermediate students.
- To build capacity among teachers who are supporting intermediate students to use OneNote software.
- To create dialogue between teachers to facilitate the transition of at risk learners to secondary school.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARTICIPATING TEACHERS

- Participate in regular training sessions with selected students on the organizational tools of OneNote.
- Support selected students to use OneNote for organization in their core and rotary classes.
- Participate in professional development sessions with other teachers involved in the pilot.
- Collect pre and post data.

ONENOTE PILOT

WORKING IN COLLABORATION WITH THE ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY (AT) TEAM

The OneNote Pilot is open to teachers of Intermediate Special Education classes (e.g., HSP, ISP) who are interested in developing the organizational skills of their students for the 2013-14 school year.

OneNote software enables students to create digital binders to organize notes, pictures, web pages and other media that are accessible at school and at home. OneNote allows students to respond using text, audio and images.

Professional development and training will be provided for students and special education teachers throughout the school year.

Students will receive in-school training to create their digital binders and to learn a variety of tools in OneNote to support organization and planning.

This project will be evaluated in June to determine the next steps .
